

Future tenses recap (Wiederholung Zeitformen der Zukunft)

be going to + infinitive:

1. To say what we are planning to do:
(Um zu sagen, was man selber sicher plant zu tun)
2. We usually use the short form:
(Wir benutzen gewöhnlich die Kurzform,
I'm statt I am)

I'm **going to go** shopping after work today. (It's planned)

Ich werde heute nach der Arbeit Einkaufen gehen. (Es ist fest geplant)

With my new job, I'm **going to have** more time with my family. (I'm 100% sure)

(Mit/in meinem neuen Job werde ich mehr Zeit für meine Familie haben. (Ich bin mir 100% sicher)

will + infinitive:

1. To predict what we'll do in the future
(Um vorherzusagen, was wir in der Zukunft tun werden)
2. To say what is possible
(Um zu sagen, was möglich ist)
3. Spontaneous Actions (Spontane Aktionen)
Ok, I'll take that. (Gut, ich nehme/wähle das hier)
4. We usually use the short form with the expressions *I think* and *I hope*:
(Gewöhnlich benutzen wir die Kurzform I'll = I will zusammen mit den Ausdrücken *Ich denke/meine* und Ich hoffe:)

I **think** I'll go shopping after work today (it's possible, but I'm not sure)

(Ich denke, ich werde (wohl) heute Einkaufen gehen nach der Arbeit.(es ist möglich, aber ich bin mir nicht sicher))

With my new job, I **hope** I'll have more time with my family. (I'm not sure)

(Mit/in meinem neuen Job werde ich hoffentlich mehr Zeit für meine Familie haben. (Ich bin mir aber nicht sicher.))

Achtung: bei Verneinung: will + not = won't

She probably **won't** get the new job.

(Sie wird wahrscheinlich den neuen Job nicht bekommen.)

Tom: Yes, hello. I'm going to have a few weeks off work this summer and would like to go somewhere exotic. I'm really interested in your adventure packages.

Travel agent: Great. We have many exciting holiday packages to choose from. Please hold the line and I'll check what offers are still available..... Thank you for holding. How about spending three weeks exploring Chile on foot?

Tom: That's not really what I had in mind. Do you have any holiday packages with water sports?

Travel agent: One moment. I'll see what else I can find in our system.... How about the French Riviera?

Tom: Actually, I've always wanted to go there.

Travel agent: You can spend seven incredible days at a 4-star spa and wellness hotel with a breathtaking view of the sea from your hotel room balcony. This action-packed holiday includes scuba diving, jet skiing, paragliding and one speed-boat ride.

Tom: Perfect! I'll take it. How much does it cost?

Travel agent: With full room and board, it costs €1,235.00. Without lunch and dinner, it will only cost you €995.

Tom: Does that include the flight?

Travel agent: No, it doesn't. Where are you planning on flying out of?

Tom: I am going to fly out of Baden-Baden.

Travel agent: Let me see how much extra that will cost... It'll be an extra €120.

Tom: Ok, sounds good. I'll book the whole package, including all three meals. Do you accept Master Card?

Travel agent: No, I'm afraid we don't. We only accept Visa.

Tom: Ok. Then I'll pay with my Visa card.
